Benton County Mental Health Tax Effective July 1, 2022

Effective July 1, 2022, local sales and use tax within Benton County, will increase one-tenth of one percent (.001). The tax will be used for chemical dependency or mental health purposes.

Businesses must collect the appropriate new rates of sales tax for retail sales and services provided within Benton County. Persons or businesses within Benton County will be subject to the new rates of use tax on items purchased for their personal or business use if sales tax has not been paid.
