

Small Estate Affidavit for Nonresident Decedents

This Affidavit may be used if the owner of the unclaimed personal property at issue was not a resident of the State of Washington on the date of his or her death. Claimants should use the "Affidavit of Successor" form if the owner was a resident of the State of Washington at the time of his or her death.
