1	Petition withdrawals	The King County Board of Equalization (Board) is accepting petition withdrawals via their eAppeal software system. The eAppeal withdrawal documents provided to the Department of Revenue (Department) do not include a written request to withdraw the petition by the taxpayer or representative. The document states in the subject line, appellant has a request to withdraw appeal, but has no actual written request to withdraw by the appellant. The Board provided the Department with petition withdrawal requests by the taxpayer or representative for requests made outside of the Appeals format.	Pending Completion	Yes To determine if the Board of Equalization has met the requirement, the Department expects the Board of Equalization to provide: • Copies of five complete petition files that include a petition withdrawal request via the eAppeals format, for the 2023 assessment year.
2	Evidence	The Board discontinued their practice of forwarding additional evidence provided by appellants to the King County Assessor (Assessor).	Completed	No
3	Confidential information	The Board has not changed their procedures as required in the Department's 2021 Review of the King County Board of Equalization. The Board is currently working with their prosecuting attorney to resolve questions regarding their process for keeping confidential evidence within the petition files.
