PROPERTY TAX COLLECTIONS--2005

Collections data are obtained from county treasurers for all taxing districts imposing an ad valorem property tax, either authorized by statute or approved by voters. Special benefit assessments levied on other than an ad valorem basis are not included.

PROPERTY TAXES DUE IN 2005 (TABLES 1 AND 2)

Property taxes levied in 2004 and due in 2005 were \$6,886.9 million, increasing \$306.8 million, or 4.7 percent, from the amount due in 2004. Collections of taxes due in 2005 totaled \$6,767.7 million, increasing \$335.5 million, or 5.2 percent, from 2004. The collection response rate in 2005 of 98.3 percent was up from the 97.8 percent rate in 2004.

During the year, tax roll additions (omitted property, property removed from exempt status, and new structures not previously on the rolls) exceeded tax roll cancellations (transfer to exempt status, correction of errors, destroyed property, and uncollectible accounts) by \$43.5 million. The resulting year-end unpaid balance was \$162.8 million, down \$7.4 million from 2004. This amount equaled 2.4 percent of the 2005 tax roll.

King County led all counties last year with a 99.9 percent collection response. Garfield County followed with 98.8 percent and Clallam County with 98.6 percent. All together, 35 counties reported collection rates of 95 percent or above, leaving four counties collecting less than 95 percent.

DELINQUENT PROPERTY TAXES (TABLES 3 AND 4)

Delinquent taxes (taxes on the rolls previous to the 2005 tax year) were \$288.3 million. Of this amount, plus additions, \$169.3 million was collected during the year. The statewide response rate is 58.7 percent.

Thirty-five counties had a 50 percent or better collection rate in 2005 which is up from 33 counties in 2004. For 2005, 21 counties had delinquent collection rates of 60 percent or greater which is up from 13 counties in 2004.

CURRENT AND DELINQUENT PROPERTY TAXES (TABLES 5 AND 6)

The combined amount of current and delinquent taxes due in 2005 for all 39 counties was \$7,175.3 million. Collections totaled \$6,937 million, 96.7 percent of the total due. At the end of 2005, delinquent taxes were \$269.6 million, down \$18.8 million, a decrease of 6.5 percent from 2004. Although the collection of current taxes was 98.3 percent (as noted above), the collection rate was 100.7 percent of current roll, taking into account both current and delinquent taxes.
